# "4 rules to uphold"

Please note that in addition to the separation and collection rules, there are other rules determined locally to ensure the clean use of collection sites. Always follow the rules for your area.

Rule

Dispose of waste and recyclables in the designated bags.

# Rule 2

Put your garbage out on the designated days by 8 a.m.

Rule 3

Dispose of waste in accordance with the designated separating rules.



Place general burnable waste into yellow designated bags bearing indications that they are Matsusaka City designated garbage bags (for burnable waste) and secure the opening tightly before disposal.

Pots, kettles, frying pans, steel cans, etc.

#### Ceramics

Bowls, plates, vases, ceramic pots. ornaments, etc.

#### Glass

Light bulbs, heat-resistant glass, cups, mirrors, etc.







### Home appliances(non-rechargeable appliances)

Vacuum cleaners, fans, rice cookers, ovens, electric water heaters. portable stereos. calculators, etc.

#### Bicycles

«Clearly indicate as waste. \*Remove batteries from electric assist bicycles. (Indicate that the battery has been removed)

• Place general non-burnable waste into a transparent or semi-transparent bag that makes it possible to see the contents for

disposal.



### Recycling small home appliances (P.16)

In order to appropriately collect and dispose of precious metals contained in small appliances, they are collected at "Collection boxes". (See page 16 for the location of collection boxes.)



The size of the opening for collection boxes is 15 cm (height) by 30 cm (width). Do not place items in the box

that are larger than the opening.









# Matsusaka City Waste and 3Rs

# Let's start by separating burnable waste!

[Results of burnable waste composition analysis] (Averages for fiscal 2016-2018)

Paper, raw waste and plastic accounts for approx. 75% of all waste.

By separating these resources out of burnable waste, we can greatly reduce the amount of trash.

### Important reminders for recycling

### ①Separate waste properly.

OWaste cannot be reborn as reusable materials if it is mixed with different types of waste.

### **2**Clean items before disposal.

OWhen dirty items are mixed in with clean ones, the clean items become dirty and products made using the recyclable materials are of a lower quality.

Simply recycling items disposed of as waste does not reduce the volume of garbage. The most important way to reduce what is put out is to think of ways to reduce waste and take action.

Let's reduce the three major components of burnable waste: Paper, plastic and raw waste!

# Reducing raw waste

Stop making too much



Drain water away before you throw it out.

Approx. 80% of raw waste is water. Simply removing water lightens and reduces the volume of raw waste.



# Waste disposal starts at home and the local community.

#### Coordinated collection activities

Local neighborhood associations and kid's clubs collect old paper, clothes and empty bottles (reusable bottles). Collection dates, locations and instructions vary for each community.

[Coordinated collection activity benefits]See page 25.

Registered local neighborhood associations, kid's clubs and other community groups collect designated recyclables and can receive funding based on the amount collected.

### Making compost from raw waste

Why not try making fertilizer for your garden or vegetables using raw waste, one of the three major components of burnable waste? It reduces the amount of daily waste by half and makes easier on taking garbage out. [Subsidies for purchasing raw waste compost bins]See page 25.

There are subsidies for purchasing compost bins and other equipment for people looking to transform their household raw waste into compost.

There are mechanisms and benefit programs set up to reduce waste.

### General burnable waste

Place general burnable waste into yellow designated bags bearing indications that they are Matsusaka City designated garbage bags (for burnable waste) and secure the opening tightly before disposal.

### Futon, rugs

Fold items that won't fit into the designated garbage bags to approx. 1 m in size and tie with a package knot.





### Pruned branches, leaves, grass

Cut pruned branches into a length of approx. 1 m and thickness of approx. 5 cm before binding with cord into bundles that can be carried in one hand.



Remove soil from leaves and grass, and place in garbage bags designated by Matsusaka City.

















# Disposing of non-burnable waste

Place non-burnable waste into a transparent or semi-transparent bag that makes it possible to see the contents for disposal.

\*If the contents cannot be seen it will not be collected.

\*You cannot use garbage bags designated by Matsusaka City for non-burnable waste.

\*You cannot use garbage bags designated by other municipalities for non-burnable waste.







# Rechargeable small home appliances

Place into a transparent or semi-transparent bag for disposal.

\*You cannot put into garbage bags designated by Matsusaka City for burnable waste

- \*Collected on the collection day for recyclables as from April 2021.
- \*Applies to electrical appliances that are charged before use.
- \*Please place products that contain memory media, such as laptops, smartphones and electronic organizers, etc. into recycle boxes for small home appliances. (See page 16.)





E-cigarettes

In recent years, fires have occurred in garbage trucks and cleaning facilities as a result of rechargeable lithium-ion batteries and mobile phone batteries, etc. being mixed in with plastic waste and non-burnable waste. Properly separating waste can help to reduce these incidents.

Small rechargeable batteries, including lithium-ion batteries have this mark.

White foam trays are separated from colored trays before collection so that they can be recycled.

White foam trays refer to white trays made of styrene foam.

# Place into a transparent or semi-transparent bag for disposal. \*You cannot put into garbage bags designated by Matsusaka City for burnable waste





PET bottles have two kinds of identifying marks. The different materials are recycled using different processes and are collected separately.

### Place into a transparent or semi-transparent bag for disposal.

\*You cannot put into garbage bags designated by Matsusaka City for burnable wast



- ★Put out labels and caps with "plastic containers and bags".
- ★Lightly rinse the inside of bottles before disposal.







Make use of local recyclable collections.

There are four types of paper. Paper is divided into newspaper, cardboard boxes, magazines, mixed paper and milk cartons. Each type is recycled differently.

Bind with a package knot for disposal.

OStretch flat into bundles of a size and weight that can be carried in one hand and bind with a package knot.



- ★Applies to corrugated cardboard boxes as well.
- ★Remove anything that is not paper, including adhesive tape and metal.



### Place into a paper bag or bind with a package knot for disposal.

### Magazines and mixed paper



### How to separate

OPut candy boxes and other paper of different sizes together. Use paper bags for paper that is difficult to bind together or insert it between the pages of magazines. There are many ways to dispose of paper to make it easier to collect.

★Mixed paper includes candy boxes, tissue boxes, envelopes, post cards and copy paper.







### Open cartons and bind with a package knot.

Milk cartons

OWash the inside of milk cartons and cut them open. Once they are dry, bind them together using a package knot.



- How to separate ★Applies to milk cartons that hold 500 ml or more and juice cartons with a white lining.
  - ★Excludes cartons under 500 ml and cartons with a silver lining. Dispose of such items as burnable waste.









Excludes cartons with a silver lining.



Old clothes can be used again as second-hand clothing or can be recycled as material for textiles. In either case, only put out clean clothes for collection.

### Place into a transparent or semi-transparent bag for disposal.

### Old clothes

 Separate items that can be used as second-hand clothes. Wash clothes before disposal.





## <Items that cannot be put out as recyclables>

### Paper

- ○When recycling paper to be used again as a raw material, please note that recycling is not possible unless the separation rules are followed and plastic and other materials other than paper are not mixed together.
- OPaper that has been treated to be waterproof, photographs, dirty food packaging or paper with a strong odor cannot be used as a material to produce good quality paper. Place such items as burnable waste in the yellow garbage bags for disposal.

# Aluminum food and beverage cans

Aluminum food and beverage cans must be separated from steel cans (collected as non-burnable waste) and are collected separately. Items marked with an aluminum can mark should be disposed of as recyclables.



Place into a transparent or semi-transparent bag for disposal.

\*You cannot put into garbage bags designated by Matsusaka City for burnable waste

# **Empty bottles**

Empty bottles includes those used for beverages, food products and cosmetics. Empty bottles can be used as recyclable material and are sorted by color and collected in specific bins.

Bins designated by your local area will be placed out the day before collection. Separate empty bottles according to color: white, brown and other.



### How to separate

- ★Lightly rinse the inside.
- ★Crowns and caps should be separated depending on the material. Separate metal crowns/caps as non-burnable waste and plastic crowns/caps together with plastic containers and bags.





★When disposing of recyclables in bags, please use transparent or semi-transparent bags. Yellow garbage bags designated by Matsusaka City are for burnable waste only.



- Recyclable storage locations do not accept items other than recyclables (burnable waste, non-burnable waste or landfill).
- •Separate recyclables according to the rules.
- •Recyclables must be clean and made of recyclable materials. Wash until clean and dry before disposal.
- •Storage locations may be closed during natural disasters such as typhoons, etc.


















# Plastic containers and bags

Look for the plastic mark 29 when separating plastic containers and bags.

### Place into a transparent or semi-transparent bag for disposal.

\*You cannot put into garbage bags designated by Matsusaka City for burnable waste.





Ensure items are empty and wash away what is left until clean. Dry thoroughly after washing.

# Recycling small home appliances

Small home appliances designated by the city are collected through "Collection boxes".

### Before placing items in the collection box...

- ★Delete all personal information from devices, etc.
- ★Remove the battery. (See page 19 for hazardous waste.)
- ★Small appliances placed in the collection box will not be returned.

## How to dispose of old personal computers

### 1. Take to the Matsusaka Recycle Center or Matsusaka Clean Center

Personal computers and computer monitors are collected at the Matsusaka Recycle Center or Matsusaka Clean Center.

### [Applicable devices]

Desktop computers, laptops, CRT displays, LED displays, all-in-one integrated computers with CRT display, all-in-one integrated computers with LED display

- \*Items with a TV tuner cannot be collected. (Please contact the manufacturer.)
- \*All computer accessories (mouse, keyboard, cables, etc.) can also be collected.
- \*\*Laptop computers can also be placed in small appliance recycling collection boxes.

#### [Collection locations] Matsusaka Recycle Center Matsusaka Clean Center

\*Please note that business hours may change over the year-end and New Year holidays, etc.



### 2. Use the home collection service (free) provided by Renet Japan Recycle, Inc.

### [What to do]

- · Please note that collections are free of charge for small home appliances
- %CRT (cathode ray tube) monitors contain hazardous materials, etc. and require a fee of 3,000 yen (tax not included) per item.

### 3. Return to computer manufacturer

Old personal computers are collected by computer manufacturers for recycling in accordance with the Law for Promotion of Effective Use of Resources.

\*\*Personal computers for home use sold after October 2003 carry the "PC Recycle mark". Personal computers carrying the "PCリサイクル (PC Recycle) mark" will be collected free of charge from the manufacturer for recycling.






# Recycling home appliances

Air conditioners, televisions, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines and clothes dryers are all recyclable home appliances and are not collected by the city. These appliances are collected by the retailer or manufacturer for recycling.

Televisions (CRT, LED, plasma)

Remember, items classed

as home appliances that should be recycled cannot be disposed of as

non-burnable waste.

- OPlease pay the recycling fee at the post office. (A transfer fee will apply.)
- ORecycling tickets are available at the post office.
- ORecycling fees may vary depending on the manufacturer.
- OFees are subject to change due to changes, etc. to consumption tax.
- OA recycling ticket (prepaid) is required when taking items directly to the Matsusaka Recycle Center or other designated handling location.
- OA recycling fee will also apply for disassembled products.
- Olf you are unsure of the manufacturer, take to the designated handling location.

Place into a transparent or semi-transparent bag for disposal.


# **★**Spray cans ★Cassette gas cannisters

You do not need to put holes in the cans. Cans pose a fire hazard. Ensure cans are empty before disposal.



### **★**Lighters

Lighters pose a fire hazard. Ensure lighters are empty before disposal.



### **★**Batteries

Only alkaline, manganese and lithium (namely coin batteries) batteries will be collected.

\*\*Please cooperate by taking small rechargeable batteries (NiCd, NiMH and Li-ion batteries) to retailers for collection.



# Fluorescent tubes

### **★**Fluorescent tubes



The city collects and recycles used household fluorescent tubes in order to promote safe collection and recycling. (Collected fluorescent tubes are recycled by a recycling contractor.)

Please take measures to prevent breakage by placing used fluorescent tubes in their original box or a separate bag.

\*Take household fluorescent tubes over 120 cm to the recyclable storage location (see page14) at each facility.

Dispose of light bulbs and LED lights as non-burnable waste.

# ★Mercury thermometers, mercury temperature gauges and mercury blood pressure monitors

\*These containing mercury can be put out together with fluorescent tubes.

### Important information

**Always** rules.





Important information for anyone taking waste to a waste disposal facility

OWhere possible, bring only one type of waste at a time. For example only burnable waste or non-burnable waste, etc.

OYour waste may not be accepted if it is not properly separated into burnable waste, non-burnable waste and recyclables, etc. or does not meet the requirements for disposal.

Owners are responsible for transporting their own waste to the facility. Please ensure that it is possible to confirm the contents of what you are bringing.

OWhen submitting the waste disposal application form, the driver of the vehicle will be required to present proof of identity (driver's license, etc.) If the owner of the waste is other than the driver, he/she will also be required to present proof of identity.

OYour waste disposal application form may be rejected if there is found to be any false information contained on the form.

OPlease note facilities can become crowded immediately after opening and just before closing. Processing may take longer at these times.


ODepending on how much waste you bring in and how often, you may be required to consent to confirmation of how the waste is generated or a site inspection.


OVehicles for bringing waste to the facility must be less than 6 m long and up to 3 tons.

## Items accepted at waste disposal facilities

Items that cannot be disposed of at waste collection sites but can be brought in directly for disposal.

- OLarge wooden furniture (remove any glass or metal parts and dispose of as non-burnable waste)
- ○Garden waste, bamboo, scrap wood that is under 2 m in length and up to a thickness of 12 cm
  - Items that do not meet requirements will not be accepted.
- \*Pack waste into bags or cover with a sheet to prevent scattering.
- OHard items that cannot be broken up (Chunks of steel, H steel beams, vises, bars, barbells, dumbbells, hydraulic jacks, boilers, etc.)
- Oltems that are difficult to dispose of (Wire rope, steel fencing, metal tire chains) should be brought in separately from non-burnable waste.
- OLarge metal furniture (excluding wooden components), sofas, spring mattresses, massage chairs, etc.
- OLaundry poles, steel pipe and galvanized sheet metal must be cut or folded into lengths up to 2 m.
- ○Equipment that contains a compressor (E.g.) Household dehumidifiers (Please talk to the Clean Center in advance.)
- \*\*Industrial waste generated through business activities is not accepted.
  (Waste materials and tatami mats generated during construction [demolition/renovations] and plastic, vinyl and metal generated through business activities are classed as industrial waste.)
- \*Do not bring in a mixture of business and household waste. If household waste is brought to the facility in a company vehicle, it will be considered to be business waste resulting in additional fees or may be rejected as industrial waste. Where possible use your own vehicle.




