1. The types of your trash



Your trash is classified into several types. You have to thoroughly separate the types of your trash before discarding. Check out the type of trash you can put out in the following chart on the back page.

2. Your collection schedule

Your household waste collection schedule is based on your location. To find out your collection day, check your waste collection calendar, which is also available on the city website.

3. Time to place trash to your designated collection area

Place trash at your designated collection area before 8 am on the day of collection.

Do not place it on the day previous to collection.



4. Preventing improper or illegal dumping

We cannot pick up your garbage if it is placed in an improper way; wrong disposal, schedule or time.

Improper waste disposal or illegal dumping are harmful to the environment of the community.

Ways to separate and dispose of trash and recyclables

<p>Burnable Waste</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ kitchen garbage ■ paper unrecyclable ■ plastic with no recycling mark or unrecyclable ■ rubber and leather products (remove any metal parts) 	<p>Designated bags</p> 
<p>Non-burnable Waste</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ small metal waste ■ home appliances (non-rechargeable) ■ glass ■ ceramics ■ blades 	<p>Transparent or Semi-transparent bags</p> 
<p>Plastic containers and bags</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ plastic bags and wrappers ■ plastic cups, tubes and bottles ■ white styrofoam trays  <p>(Remove any waste before disposal.)</p>	<p>Transparent or Semi-transparent bags</p> 
<p>Empty Bottles</p>	<p>White Brown Other</p> 	<p>Take a look at the color of the bottle opening.</p> 
<p>Recyclable</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ newspaper, magazines and other paper ■ milk cartons (Rinse, cut them open and dry) ■ old clothes ■ cardboard boxes ■ PET bottles (caps and labels as 'Plastic containers') ■ aluminum food and beverage cans ■ white styrofoam trays ■ fluorescent tubes 	<p>Check the disposal handbook.</p>
